

Public Health in the Rockies 2017

Public Health in the Rockies 2017 is rapidly approaching! Here is all the information you will need to make the most of your conference.

This year's Public Health in the Rockies will be held in Keystone, Colorado on October 4-6. The theme of the 2017 Public Health in the Rockies conference is Unlocking the Future: Embracing Innovation and Inclusiveness. This theme evolves the conversations of past years by unlocking new doors to improve health equity, foster inclusiveness, and engage partners in creative real world solutions for the ever changing field of public health. There are persistent and preventable barriers that contribute to health inequities that are reflected in established policies and practices. Through collaborative efforts with current and non-traditional partners, we can increase awareness of these inequities and encourage advocacy and innovation opportunities to improve the health of our communities.

The 2017 Conference will highlight the ongoing importance of promoting health equity and aims to:

- Encourage innovation to transform communication, practice, and policies
- Evolve common ground with non-traditional partners and build new collaboration opportunities
- Use advocacy and activism to develop a unified voice for public health and health equity
- Celebrate the power of community engagement and participation
- Provide attendees with a deeper level of leadership and professional development training
- The conference will provide insight and ideas on how to promote health equity in the region, and to showcase multidisciplinary efforts within the context of the three core functions of public health: assessment, policy, and assurance



Esther Sullivan

Assistant Professor, University of Colorado Denver

Esther Sullivan is an Assistant Professor at the University of Colorado, Denver. Her research focuses on poverty, spatial inequality, legal regulation, housing, and the built environment, with a special interest in both forced and voluntary residential mobility. Her research uses both ethnographic methods and geospatial (GIS) analysis. She holds a Ph.D. in Sociology from The University of Texas at Austin and a B.A. in English from The University of Chicago. Her work is published in *Sociological Inquiry, Journal of Contemporary Ethnography, Law & Social Inquiry, Urban*

Studies, The Chicago-Kent Law Review, City & Community, and American Sociological Review.

Her current book project Manufactured Insecurity: Mobile Home Park Evictions and Americans' Tenuous Right to Place (under contract with University of California Press) is a mixed-method look at the mass evictions that result when mobile home parks close. Living full time inside closing mobile home parks across Texas and Florida, Sullivan examines the effects of forced relocation on individuals and communities, as well as the operation of markets that profit off the low-income housing found in mobile home parks.

She is currently beginning a project that will trace the experiences of U.S. residents relocating across state lines for access to cannabis. Specifically, the project follows those moving for marijuana due to of Colorado's cannabis legalization. This project is based on interviews with and ethnography alongside self-termed marijuana "refugees" who move in search of medical treatments, precariously housed "rolling stones" who chose Colorado as a stopping point, and "cannabis capitalists," who move to emerging cannabis markets in search of profit.



Thomas Quade

Tom Quade is first and foremost a public health practitioner. He is currently the Health Commissioner for Marion County, Ohio. Prior to serving as the Health Commissioner for Marion, Tom served as the Deputy Health Commissioner for Summit County, Ohio. One of his duties in that role was to serve as the Accreditation Coordinator where he successfully facilitated the agency's successful PHAB accreditation journey, something he is currently repeating in Marion. Between 2000 and 2010, he served the City of Akron in a

number of roles, including epidemiologist, Health Promotion Division Director, Community Health Assessment and Health Promotion Division Director, Deputy Health Director, and then Interim Director of Health for the Akron Health Department.

It was during his tenure as Interim Director that he successfully guided the Akron City Health Department through its year long consolidation process with the Summit County Board of Health. Tom also holds a community faculty position with the Northeastern Ohio Medical University's Master of Public Health program.

In addition to serving APHA as the current President, Tom has served a previous 4 year term on the Executive Board, including one as its Chair. He participated on an APHA delegation to Taiwan. In his years-long role as Ohio Affiliate representative on the APHA Governing Council, Mr. Quade served on the Council on Affiliates both as representative from Region V and as the Action Board Representative to the COA. Tom also served as the Chairperson of APHA's Affiliate Capacity Building Initiative for two years, and has been the Ohio Public Health Association President. In addition to his service to APHA and OPHA, Quade has held several national appointments including service on the board of directors of the National Board of Public Health Examiners and the board of directors of the Foundation to Advance Public Health through Certification (FAPHC). He ha also served as the Chairperson for a National Association of County and City Health Officials workgroup on Health and Disability. Tom is an experienced site visitor for the Public Health Accreditation Board and has chaired multiple site visit teams.

Tom earned his MPH from Yale University in 1999 and his professional public health credential in 2008 as part of the first class. His previous public health experience included work as a public health specialist for the World Health Organization in Rome, Italy, where he participated on a team of public health specialists assessing and coordinating public health responses during the Kosovo crisis in 1999. He served in the United State Peace Corps in the Kingdom of Nepal prior to pursuing his degree in public health. Prior to that Tom, earned his MA in Counselor Education from the University of Cincinnati, after which he worked for a number of years in New Jersey in a family counseling role with families who had a member living with developmental disabilities who were at risk of out of home placement.

Tom considers his local service involvement to be supportive of what he describes as a broad community health system. His current local service includes active membership on the Marion Black Heritage Council, Marion League of Women Voters, Marion Rotary, Marion Minority Commission, and as Chair of the Marion United Way 2016 Annual Campaign. He maintains ongoing mentoring relationships with a number of public health undergraduate and graduate students, and early career professionals. He also serves on the Summit County Board of Developmental Disabilities.

Friday's Plenary: World Café








Title: Colorado Public Health Student "Speed Networking": Meet the Professionals and Harness your Future


